Welcome to ACG 2011, ACG's Annual Scientific Meeting and Postgraduate Course, the premier GI clinical event of the year. The Postgraduate Course Directors and ACG's Educational Affairs Committee, along with the Friday Course Directors, have brought together internationally recognized experts and rising stars in the field. This year's program promises to deliver the latest clinical updates in gastroenterology and hepatology, plus discuss what is on the horizon that may impact your practice.

Back by popular demand is the Hands-on Workshop Center. Located in the Exhibit Hall, we've expanded the sessions in the Hands-on Workshop Center to 15 (plus 5 additional for GI fellows). We had another strong showing for abstract submissions this year, matching last year's best ever record. In total, you'll find nearly 1,300 abstracts selected for either oral or poster presentation. I congratulate all of our colleagues for their research efforts and I encourage you to attend the oral presentations and to view the posters during the three-day Annual Meeting.

We will again offer Poster Rounds with the Experts. Each day of the poster sessions, well-known experts will lead attendees around to posters of interest. This is a great opportunity to discuss posters, garner insight from the experts, and make new contacts with other attendees in a low-key, relaxed atmosphere. Poster Rounds with the Experts runs from Sunday through Tuesday.

Last but certainly not least is the President's Reception. This year's President's Reception will be held in the Exhibit Hall on Sunday evening, 5:15 pm – 7:00 pm, immediately following the Postgraduate Course. It's a great opportunity to mingle with your colleagues as you explore the latest diagnostic and therapeutic offerings from exhibitors. Spouses and guests are also invited to attend. Don't forget to bring your name badge so you may enter the Exhibit Hall.

The 76th Annual Scientific Meeting of the American College of Gastroenterology will be conducted on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday, October 31 – November 2, 2011, in conjunction with the Annual Postgraduate Course on Saturday and Sunday, October 29–30, 2011, at the Gaylord National Hotel and Convention Center in Washington, DC. The optional Annual Practice Management Course will be held on Friday, October 28 for a full day of practice management tips. Four additional optional programs will be held on Friday, October 28: (1) a half-day GI Pathophysiology course, (2) a full-day ASGE-sponsored endoscopy course, (3) a half-day GI Pharmacology course, and (4) an evening course focusing on recertification preparation. There will also be an optional lunch program on Sunday, October 30, and an optional breakfast program on Monday, October 31, for NP/PA Providers.

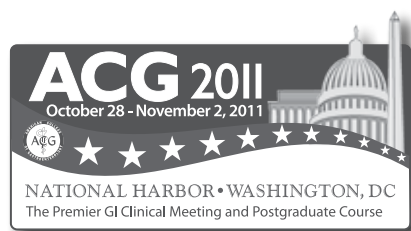

ACG's 2011 Educational Programs — Needs Assessment

Clinical gastroenterology continues to experience an ever increasing array of options and advancements affecting both the diagnosis and treatment of gastrointestinal (GI) disorders. Busy gastroenterologists must stay abreast of the diagnostic and treatment options that are available for managing their patients and effectively utilize them while maximizing quality and safety.

The multi-faceted pressures of new and increasing scientific developments, pressures from payors and policymakers and demands by more knowledgeable patients mandate that gastroenterologists find ways to constantly reevaluate the diagnostic techniques and treatment modalities used and mechanisms for delivery in their practices. Declining reimbursement and an insufficient work force also remain significant challenges for gastroenterologists and their practices. As a consequence, it is important to identify more efficient ways to obtain the latest scientific knowledge and institute scientifically sound therapy so that the highest quality of patient care can be maintained. This objective, regardless of the specific practice setting, is to guarantee that each individual patient obtains the treatment and service that is the best possible option for their specific needs.

The emphasis of ACG's educational efforts focuses on these advancements in diagnosis and treatment options, as well as on the policies, procedures, and guidelines gastroenterologists employ in the overall management of their practices. The CME educational program goal is to heighten the knowledge of clinicians and other health care professionals involved in GI patient care in all areas of management, with an emphasis on those conditions with increasing prevalence and those where management continues to present a challenge. Attention is also placed on advanced and improved endoscopic techniques and practice management tools that can increase gastroenterologists' efficiency and effectiveness in their daily practice.

The proper use of screening techniques that lead to prevention of or an early diagnosis of specific disease conditions is critical. This includes encouraging screening and surveillance for colorectal cancer. Colorectal cancer is the third most commonly diagnosed cancer among both men and women; however, colon cancer incidence rates have declined over the last two decades and survival rates have increased. This likely relates at least in part to increased colorectal cancer screening and surveillance, which allows physicians to detect and remove pre-cancerous polyps or cancers at an early stage. Although these trends are moving in a positive direction, there remains a need to increase the number of individuals being screened. In addition, new tests have been developed in recent years for the purpose of colorectal cancer screening. Providing gastroenterologists with knowledge of the most effective and efficient means to conduct the screening and surveillance of colorectal cancer continues to be very important. Furthermore, providing and quantifying indicators that define a quality colonoscopy, including prep quality and adenoma detection rates, especially in light of recent findings on the prevalence of flat lesions, is a need that affects the gastroenterologist each time a screening colonoscopy is performed. As the survival rates from these GI cancers continue to improve, the need to continue educating the gastroenterologists providing ongoing care to these patients increases. This important and evolving educational need must be met in a way that touches on the impact of various forms of cancer on the overall health and quality of life of these patients.

One condition that has drastically increased in prevalence in the U.S. is obesity; from less than 15% in the 1960s to over 30% at present. It has been predicted that if the rates continue at their current pace, by 2015, 75% of adults will be overweight or obese. Therefore, not only is it imperative for gastroenterologists to be knowledgeable regarding obesity prevention and treatment options, but it is also important that they understand the importance of patient education. Patient education is a necessity to improve compliance and to achieve desired treatment results. In those patients who undergo surgery for the management of obesity, information on the post-surgical complications in bariatric surgery patients and their management has become increasingly important. These topics, as well as the latest information on what GI conditions are tied to or made worse by obesity, have been requested as areas of further education by practicing gastroenterologists.

An area of gastroenterology that continues to see important developments in diagnostic and medical therapeutic options is inflammatory bowel disease. The gastroenterologist must be fully aware of the latest developments in biologic and immunomodulator therapies including safety considerations and their place in patient management. In addition, in recent years there have been many advances made in laboratory, radiographic and endoscopic modalities that directly impact on diagnosis of inflammatory bowel disease and on surveillance for dysplasia in ulcerative colitis. Education regarding optimizing the use of such modalities is important to the practicing gastroenterologist. The post-surgical management of inflammatory bowel disease patients also continues to be a topic of great importance and one in which the clinician often faces challenges due to the complexity and unpredictability of the condition and the associated decision-making process.

The gastroenterologist is frequently faced with challenges related to liver disorders including hepatitis B and C, NAFLD, hepatic encephalopathy, cirrhosis, and autoimmune liver diseases. Often, the gastroenterologist relies on the expertise of the hepatologist to assist in the management of these patients; however, with hepatologists operating at capacity, the gastroenterologist must be able to offer the best quality of care and treatment options to patients with liver disease. With the increased incidence of hepatitis C and NAFLD, practical and clinically relevant physician education is extremely important in this area.

Pancreaticobiliary diseases can also be extremely challenging to manage. Gastroenterologists can offer highly specialized care for such patients including interventional endoscopic procedures. Education on the diagnosis and management of various forms of pancreaticobiliary disease including pancreatitis, pancreatic cysts, pancreatic cancer and biliary disorders is critical to obtaining the best patient outcomes.

Improvements in the understanding of the pathogenesis and treatment of motility and functional GI disorders continue to progress as research in this area expands. These disorders are among the most common GI disorders in the general population. Understanding the latest science with regard to these disorders and newer treatment modalities is critical to improving clinical outcomes and quality of life for a large group of patients who have been among the most difficult to treat. Understanding the potential role of enteric microbiota and inflammation in these disorders will also help determine the appropriate course of action and play a critical role in managing these challenging conditions.

Diarrheal disorders can prove to be challenging to diagnose and manage. Whether it be acute or chronic, caused by a malabsorptive condition, inflammatory or infectious process, gastroenterologists must be aware of the various potential causes of diarrhea and the most appropriate corresponding treatment options. With the incidence and severity of *Clostridium difficile* infections increasing in recent years, this is yet another condition that demands close attention by the gastroenterologist.

GI bleeding remains one of the most common yet most challenging issues confronted by the clinical gastroenterologist. Whether the GI bleeding is related to drug therapy, stress ulceration in the intensive care unit, anticoagulation, chronic liver disease or obscure gastrointestinal bleeding, the gastroenterologist must be up to date on the latest information on strategies to prevent, diagnose and optimally treat GI bleeding. This includes providing accurate, practical information directly to patients and referring physicians.

Gastroesophageal reflux disease is a common condition world-wide. An understanding of its pathophysiology, diagnosis, treatment options and complications is extremely important for the practicing gastroenterologist. Other upper GI conditions including Barrett's esophagus, eosinophilic esophagitis, dyspepsia, peptic ulcer disease and *H. pylori* also require a clear understanding. It is important that published evidence-based practice guidelines for these upper GI conditions and many other identified GI disorders be available to the gastroenterologist for their explicit understanding and to enhance their ability to most effectively manage each of their patients.

Rapid technological advancements in endoscopy and other diagnostic and therapeutic areas in gastroenterology creates a need to communicate the latest techniques and strategies for dealing with everything from patients with altered anatomy to identification and removal of large and difficult polyps to the developing practice of natural orifice transluminal endoscopic surgery. In addition to using the same technology in a more efficient manner, new technological developments permit the gastroenterologist to observe areas of the GI tract that have not traditionally been viewable, such as the small bowel. Capsule endoscopy and other deep enteroscopy techniques allow for a more extensive evaluation of the small bowel. The development of CT colonography requires the gastroenterologist to fully understand the advantages and disadvantages of this technology as well as how to perform the procedure, interpret and act upon the findings. Gastroenterologists in a variety of practice settings need to learn and integrate these new therapies into their practice in order to provide state-of-the-art services to their patients.

Finally, it is critical that gastroenterologists incorporate quality, safety and service metrics into their clinical practice. In particular, quality and safety issues in the endoscopy suite need to be addressed in order to improve patient outcomes. Other quality issues dealing with specific disease states and their management in the office practice also need to be addressed by the practicing gastroenterologist. Practice efficiency is also of great importance as the demand for increased efficiency across all settings continues to drive the search for practical tools to positively impact care delivery and patient outcomes. Through the use of evidence-based approaches for treatment and rational public health policy, clinicians need to identify new and innovative ways to deliver care across the community. The ever expanding access to information on a real-time basis by both clinicians and patients provides unique opportunities as well as challenges to the healthcare delivery system. When this is combined with the pressures associated with increased spending on healthcare in an environment that currently is trending towards decreased reimbursement and does not adequately reward the physician for spending more time with the patient, the importance of high quality continuing medical education for gastroenterologists and their patients cannot be overstated.

BRIEF SUMMARY of Prescribing Information.

INDICATIONS AND USAGE

Treatment of GERD NEXIUM is indicated for the short-term treatment (4 to 8 weeks) for healing and symptomatic resolution and maintenance (controlled studies do not extend beyond 6 months) of confirmed erosive esophagitis (EE); the treatment of heartburn and other symptoms associated with GERD; **Risk Reduction of NSAID-Associated Gastric Ulcer; *H. pylori* Eradication to Reduce the Risk of Duodenal Ulcer Recurrence; Pathological Hypersecretory Conditions Including Zollinger-Ellison Syndrome.**

DOSAGE AND ADMINISTRATION

Please see full Prescribing Information for recommended dosages, dosage adjustments, and administration options for **Special Populations. Information for Patients** NEXIUM is available as a delayed-release capsule or for delayed-release oral suspension. NEXIUM should be taken at least one hour before meals. Administration Options: 1) NEXIUM Delayed Release Capsules should be swallowed whole. For patients who have difficulty swallowing capsules, open the capsule and mix the granules with one tablespoon of applesauce. Swallow immediately without chewing or crushing. Do not store for future use. The applesauce should not be hot. 2) NEXIUM For Delayed-Release Oral Suspension: Stir the contents of a packet with 1 tablespoon (15 mL) of water. Leave 2 to 3 minutes to thicken. Stir and drink within 30 minutes. If any material remains after drinking, add more water, stir, and drink immediately. Antacids may be used while taking NEXIUM.

CONTRAINDICATIONS

NEXIUM is contraindicated in patients with known hypersensitivity to any component of the formulation [see **Description** (11) in full Prescribing Information] or to substituted benzimidazoles. Hypersensitivity reactions, e.g., angioedema and anaphylactic reaction/shock, have been reported with NEXIUM use.

WARNINGS AND PRECAUTIONS

Concurrent Gastric Malignancy

Symptomatic response to therapy with NEXIUM does not preclude the presence of gastric malignancy.

Atrophic Gastritis

Atrophic gastritis has been noted occasionally in gastric corpus biopsies from patients treated long-term with omeprazole, of which NEXIUM is an enantiomer.

Bone Fracture

Several published observational studies suggest that proton pump inhibitor (PPI) therapy may be associated with an increased risk for osteoporosis-related fractures of the hip, wrist, or spine. The risk of fracture was increased in patients who received high-dose, defined as multiple daily doses, and long-term PPI therapy (a year or longer). Patients should use the lowest dose and shortest duration of PPI therapy appropriate to the condition being treated. Patients at risk for osteoporosis-related fractures should be managed according to established treatment guidelines [see **Dosage and Administration** and **Adverse Reactions**].

Risks of Amoxicillin (as Part of *H. pylori* Triple Therapy)

[See Warnings and Precautions in the prescribing information for amoxicillin for complete information.] Serious and occasionally fatal hypersensitivity (anaphylactic) reactions have been reported in patients on penicillin therapy. These reactions are more apt to occur in individuals with a history of penicillin hypersensitivity and/or a history of sensitivity to multiple allergens. There have been well documented reports of individuals with a history of penicillin hypersensitivity reactions that have experienced severe hypersensitivity reactions when treated with a cephalosporin. Before initiating therapy with any penicillin, careful inquiry should be made concerning previous hypersensitivity reactions to penicillins, cephalosporins, and other allergens. If an allergic reaction occurs, amoxicillin should be discontinued and the appropriate therapy instituted. Serious anaphylactic reactions require immediate emergency treatment with epinephrine. Oxygen, intravenous steroids, and airway management, including intubation, should also be administered as indicated. Pseudomembranous colitis has been reported with nearly all antibacterial agents, including clarithromycin and amoxicillin, and may range in severity from mild to life threatening. Therefore, it is important to consider this diagnosis in patients who present with diarrhea subsequent to the administration of antibacterial agents. Treatment with antibacterial agents alters the normal flora of the colon and may permit overgrowth of clostridia. Studies indicate that a toxin produced by *Clostridium difficile* is a primary cause of "antibiotic-associated colitis". After the diagnosis of pseudomembranous colitis has been established, therapeutic measures should be initiated. Mild cases of pseudomembranous colitis usually respond to discontinuation of the drug alone. In moderate to severe cases, consideration should be given to management with fluids and electrolytes, protein supplementation, and treatment with an antibacterial drug clinically effective against *Clostridium difficile* colitis.

Risks of Clarithromycin (as Part of *H. pylori* Triple Therapy)

[See Warnings and Precautions in the prescribing information for clarithromycin for complete information.] Clarithromycin should not be used in pregnant women except in clinical circumstances where no alternative therapy is appropriate. If pregnancy occurs while taking clarithromycin, the patient should be apprised of the potential hazard to the fetus. Concomitant administration of clarithromycin with cisapride, pimozide, astemizole, terfenadine, ergotamine, or dihydroergotamine is contraindicated.

Hypomagnesemia

Hypomagnesemia, symptomatic and asymptomatic, has been reported rarely in patients treated with PPIs for at least three months, in most cases after a year of therapy. Serious adverse events include tetany, arrhythmias, and seizures. In most patients, treatment of hypomagnesemia required magnesium replacement and discontinuation of the PPI. For patients expected to be on prolonged treatment or who take PPIs with medications such as digoxin or drugs that may cause hypomagnesemia (e.g., diuretics), health care professionals may consider monitoring magnesium levels prior to initiation of PPI treatment and periodically [see **Adverse Reactions**].

Concomitant use of NEXIUM with St John's Wort or rifampin

Drugs which induce CYP2C19 or CYP3A4 (such as St John's Wort or rifampin) can substantially decrease esomeprazole concentrations [see **Drug Interactions**]. Avoid concomitant use of NEXIUM with St John's Wort, or rifampin.

Interactions with Investigations for Neuroendocrine Tumors

Serum chromogranin A (CgA) levels increase secondary to drug-induced decreases in gastric acidity. The increased CgA level may cause false positive results in diagnostic investigations for neuroendocrine tumors. Providers should temporarily stop esomeprazole treatment before assessing CgA levels and consider repeating the test if initial CgA levels are high. If serial tests are performed (e.g. for monitoring), the same commercial laboratory should be used for testing, as reference ranges between tests may vary.

ADVERSE REACTIONS

Clinical Studies Experience

Because clinical trials are conducted under widely varying conditions, adverse reaction rates observed in the clinical trials of a drug cannot be directly compared to rates in the clinical trials of another drug and may not reflect the rates observed in practice. The safety of NEXIUM was evaluated in over 15,000 patients (aged 18 to 84 years) in clinical trials worldwide including over 8,500 patients in the United States and over 6,500 patients in Europe and Canada. Over 2,900 patients were treated in long-term studies for up to 6-12 months. In general, NEXIUM was well tolerated in both short and long-term clinical trials. The safety of NEXIUM was evaluated in 316 pediatric and adolescent patients aged 1 to 17 years in four clinical trials for the treatment of symptomatic GERD [see **Clinical Studies** (14.2) in full Prescribing Information]. In 109 pediatric patients aged 1 to 11 years, the most frequently reported ($\geq 1\%$) treatment-related adverse reactions were diarrhea (2.8%), headache (1.9%) and somnolence (1.9%). In 149 pediatric patients aged 12 to 17 years the most frequently reported ($\geq 2\%$) treatment related adverse reactions were headache (8.1%), abdominal pain (2.7%), diarrhea (2%), and nausea (2%). No new safety concerns were identified in pediatric patients. Safety in the treatment of healing EE was assessed in 4 randomized comparative clinical trials (1,240 patients on NEXIUM 20 mg, 2,434 patients on NEXIUM 40 mg, and 3,008 patients on omeprazole 20 mg daily). The most frequent adverse events ($\geq 1\%$) in all 3 groups were headache (5.5, 5.0, and 3.8, respectively) and diarrhea (no difference among all groups). Nausea, flatulence, abdominal pain, constipation, and dry mouth occurred at similar rates in those taking NEXIUM or omeprazole. Additional adverse reactions reported as possibly related to NEXIUM with an incidence $<1\%$ are listed by body system: **Body as a Whole:** abdomen enlarged, allergic reaction, asthenia, back pain, chest pain, substernal chest pain, edema (facial, leg, peripheral or generalized), hot flushes, fatigue, fever, flu-like disorder, malaise, pain, rigors; **Cardiovascular:** flushing, hypertension, tachycardia; **Endocrine:** goiter; **Gastrointestinal:** bowel irregularity, constipation aggravated, dyspepsia, dysphagia, dysplasia GI, epigastric pain, eructation, esophageal disorder, frequent stools, gastroenteritis, GI hemorrhage, GI symptoms not otherwise specified, hiccup, melena, mouth disorder, pharynx disorder, rectal disorder, serum gastrin increased, tongue disorder, tongue edema, ulcerative stomatitis, vomiting; **Hearing:** earache, tinnitus; **Hematologic:** anemia, anemia hypochromic, cervical lympho-adenopathy, epistaxis, leukocytosis, leukopenia, thrombocytopenia; **Hepatic:** bilirubinemia, hepatic function abnormal, SGOT and SGPT increased; **Metabolic/Nutritional:** glycosuria, hyperuricemia, hyponatremia, increased alkaline phosphatase, thirst, vitamin B12 deficiency, weight change; **Musculoskeletal:** arthralgia, arthritis aggravated, arthropathy, cramps, fibromyalgia syndrome, hernia, polymyalgia rheumatica; **Nervous System/Psychiatric:** anorexia, apathy, appetite increased, confusion, depression aggravated, dizziness, hypertonía, nervousness, hypoaesthesia, impotence, insomnia, migraine, migraine aggravated, paresthesia, sleep disorder, somnolence, tremor, vertigo, visual field defect; **Reproductive:** dysmenorrhea, menstrual disorder, vaginitis; **Respiratory:** asthma aggravated, coughing, dyspnea, larynx edema, pharyngitis, rhinitis, sinusitis; **Skin/Appendages:** acne, angioedema, dermatitis, pruritus, pruritus ani, rash, rash erythematous, rash maculopapular, skin inflammation, sweating increased, urticaria; **Special Senses:** otitis media, parosmia, taste loss, taste perversion; **Urogenital:** abnormal urine, albuminuria, cystitis, dysuria, fungal infection, hematuria, micturition frequency, moniliasis, genital moniliasis, polyuria; **Visual:** conjunctivitis, vision abnormal. Endoscopic findings that were reported as adverse events include: duodenitis, esophagitis, esophageal stricture, esophageal ulceration, esophageal varices, gastric ulcer, gastritis, hernia, benign polyps or nodules, Barrett's esophagus, and mucosal discoloration. In two placebo-controlled studies, 710 patients were treated for symptomatic GERD and the most common adverse events possibly or probably related to NEXIUM were diarrhea (4.3%), headache (3.8%), and abdominal pain (3.8%). **Postmarketing Experience** The following adverse reactions have been identified during post-approval use of NEXIUM. Because these reactions are reported voluntarily from a population of uncertain size, it is not always possible to reliably estimate their frequency or establish a causal relationship to drug exposure. These reports are listed below by body system: **Blood:** agranulocytosis, pancytopenia; **Eye:** blurred vision; **Gastrointestinal:** pancreatitis, stomatitis; **Hepatobiliary:** hepatic failure, hepatitis with or without jaundice; **Immune System:** anaphylactic reaction/shock; **Infections and Infestations:** GI candidiasis; **Metabolism and Nutritional Disorders:** hypomagnesemia; **Musculoskeletal:** muscular weakness, myalgia, bone fracture; **Nervous System:** hepatic encephalopathy, taste disturbance; **Psychiatric:** aggression, agitation, depression,
