MEMBERSHIP in the American College of Gastroenterology is multidisciplinary, including gastroenterologists, hepatologists, surgeons, radiologists, pediatricians, pathologists, physician assistants, nurse practitioners, nurses, and others with a shared interest in the care of patients with digestive diseases. ACG is clinically focused and provides members with the education and tools they need to better serve their patients, improve their practice, and advance the field of gastroenterology with research and leadership training. Fellowship (FACG) is an honor bestowed by the College in recognition of significant professional achievement and superior competence within the field of gastroenterology, hepatology, pediatric gastroenterology, gastrointestinal surgery, gastrointestinal radiology, or gastrointestinal pathology.

THE BOARD OF GOVERNORS is one of the most unique aspects of the College's governance. Governors are ACG Fellows and Masters who are elected from the membership of a particular state or region. There are currently 76 Governors across seven different regions in the United States and abroad. The Board of Governors acts as a two-way conduit between College leadership and the membership at large. This helps the College make certain it is meeting the evolving needs of the membership. The ACG Governors also act as a grassroots force on important issues facing gastroenterologists and organized medicine at large at both the national and state levels. Finally, the Board of Governors is also an integral part of the College's membership outreach activities.

COMMITTEES: The College has 24 different committees with more than 900 committee members. Many of the policy and project decisions reached by the ACG Board of Trustees begin with ideas raised at the committee meetings and developed by a specific committee.

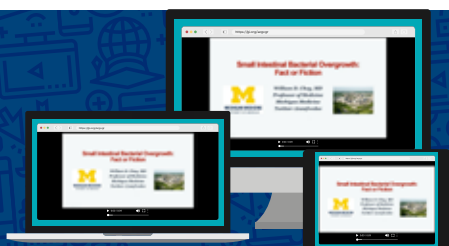

Education Universe

ACG's Education Universe is an online education platform that offers online self-directed CME education programs focusing on the information that practicing/clinical gastroenterologists and advanced practice providers need to remain abreast of the latest clinical knowledge and skills, prepare for the GI Boards, recertification or obtain necessary CME outside of the ACG meetings.

The ACG Education Universe provides access to ACG's high-quality educational materials in a convenient and customizable online package. By setting parameters regarding what you want to learn and the type of material you want to review, the Education Universe develops a specialized program just for you. These programs are designed to allow you to start an activity, stop at any time, and resume where you left off. Your progress will be saved each time you log in, keep track of how much CME you have earned, and you can print certificates or a statement of your CME credits when needed.

Self-Assessment Test (SAT)

The Self-Assessment Test (SAT) is one of the main teaching tools of the College, produced annually with the Postgraduate Course. Available in both print and online, each test includes approximately 300 questions in a single best answer format, many of which include images or videos, along with detailed answers and annotated references. The online version has additional features such as: questions organized by their organ system, immediate access to correct answers, references linked to PubMed and the ability to track your progress. These tests provide a valuable review for graduating fellows taking their GI Board and established practitioners looking for a broad clinical update or preparing for recertification.

APP GI Training Series

The APP GI Training Series, part of the ACG Education Universe, includes modules for various GI and Hepatology content areas and are structured to maximize learning and allow participants to identify key diagnostics and treatments for patients. The series is designed to be completed as a full series or as individual topics.

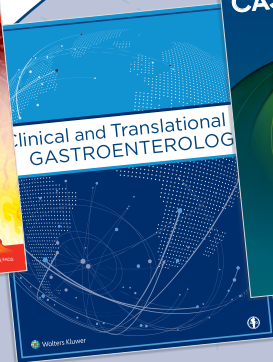

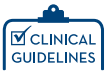

GIQuIC

GIQuIC is a collaboration between ACG and ASGE. This clinical data registry was designed by gastroenterologists for gastroenterologists to collect, organize, and display digestive healthcare data for multiple purposes, including the following:

- Improve patient outcomes by allowing users to benchmark quality, identify gaps in care, and develop specific and targeted quality improvement initiatives.
- Contribute data for research and to assist the GI societies in developing guidelines for patient care.
- Provide quality measure data to third parties, including CMS' Medicare Merit-based Incentive Payment System (MIPS), private payers, accrediting bodies, referring providers, and patients. GIQuIC is a Qualified Clinical Data Registry (QCDR) under MIPS.

The Center for Leadership, Ethics & Equity

The LE&E Center addresses the contemporary need for leadership training, equitable delivery of care, and ethically based decision-making with a suite of training programs and activities to provide transformational tools and experiences to GI clinicians. The programs under the LE&E Center include:

- **The ACG Leonidas Berry Health Equity Research Award** is a two-year award, with funding up to \$75,000 (\$50k year-one, \$25k year-two based on progress), that supports actionable science that will translate to reducing health and/or healthcare disparities, thereby promoting health equity.
- **Edgar Achkar Visiting Professorships with content related to ethical decision making, disparate health outcomes, and equitable care.** The ACG Edgar Achkar Visiting Professorship Program supports GI fellowship programs by providing high-quality visiting professors to bolster the training program with lectures, small group discussions, panel discussions, and one-on-one visits with trainees and faculty. ACG Institute covers the travel costs and honorarium; the program chooses the speaker. This program includes the option to focus on equity, diversity, and/or ethical care as stand-alone lectures or in conjunction with a disease state topic-driven visit (i.e., Disparities in Colorectal Cancer Screening).
- **Scholarships for High School Students** through the Prescriptions for Success: Careers in Medicine High School Visit. The ACG partners with a high school in the Annual Meeting host city each year. ACG sends a group of physicians and healthcare professionals to visit with students and provide first-hand perspectives on how to become a physician/medical professional, with a focus placed on choosing the field of gastroenterology, and subsequently offers a \$1,000 scholarship to participating students.



The ACG Institute and LE&E Center support four distincy leadership programs, under Leadership YOU, with each program tailored to a different career stage. Leadership YOU provides an opportunity for all four cohorts to network and engage in shared learning sessions, in addition to cohort-specific professional development. - **Emerging Leadership Program:** U.S.-based ACG member physicians in their 3rd & 4th year of GI fellowship training
- **Early Career Leadership Program:** U.S.-based ACG member physicians 1-5 years post-fellowship completion. Must have completed one full year of practice after terminal GI or hepatology fellowship.
- **Advanced Leadership Program:** U.S.-based ACG member physicians 10-20 years post-fellowship completion
- **Clinical Research Leadership Program:** U.S.-based ACG member physicians 2-15 years post-fellowship completion. Recipients of grant funding as a Principal Investigator/Co-Principal Investigator from any institution or society (non-trainee, non-fellow) in the last 10 years.

SHAPING AND SUPPORTING future clinicians and innovators in GI and hepatology. ACG offers a variety of programs and courses specifically for trainees and residents, including:



ACG-FDA Visiting Fellowship Program gives a current first or second year fellow the opportunity to apply for a one-month virtual rotation at the FDA. The fellows chosen for this rotation gain valuable insight into the drug review and approval process and gain a better understanding of the day-to-day activities that inform the interactions between the FDA, academia, and industry.



IBD 101: A Primer for First-Year Gastroenterology Fellows is a 1-day educational course designed to provide first-year gastroenterology fellows with the opportunity to learn about the diagnosis and treatment of inflammatory bowel disease (IBD). IBD 101 features an intimate, interactive format led by national leaders in IBD clinical care, research, and education.



The 2nd Year Fellows Course is a weekend course, and all travel, lodging, and meal expenses are covered by ACG. In addition to general sessions, attendees rotate through small group breakout sessions that include both hands-on endoscopy training and case centered discussions by the experts which follow a meet-the-professor format to encourage two-way discussion between the fellows and faculty.



Chief Fellows Course offers general sessions and small group breakout sessions over two days. During the course Chief Fellows can network, engage in small group learning, role-play, and discuss challenging situations candidly with co-chief fellows and faculty moderators while receiving real-time feedback. The in-person course serves as an engaging and motivating experience for trainees at the cusp of their careers.



North American Conference of GI Fellows includes research presentations by the fellows, along with lectures and coaching by a distinguished faculty of gastroenterologists. Attendance at the conference is limited to twenty-five fellows and is by invitation only.



Navigating The GI Match - Tips and Tricks for Applicants is a special session at the Annual Meeting for internal medicine residents who are interested in pursuing a career in gastroenterology. This session is also available annually as a webinar each Spring.



Trainees Luncheon is a special lunch exclusively for Fellows-in-Training offered each year during the ACG Postgraduate Course. Past topics have included “The GI Job Hunt: Finding, Interviewing, and Negotiating,” “Employment Agreements and Financial Considerations,” “4th Year GI Fellowships,” and “What I Learned My First Year in Practice.”



Career Opportunities for Women in GI Luncheon is a program hosted by the Women in GI Committee geared toward residents, trainees and junior faculty who face difficult decisions regarding the future of their medical careers. Female gastroenterologists from a variety of medical backgrounds address the issues of being a female subspecialist, balancing career and family, and opportunities for women in medicine, and, more specifically, gastroenterology. This is held annually during the ACG Postgraduate Course.



Navigating, Networking, and Negotiating Your First Job Workshop is a program geared towards senior GI fellows and junior faculty, addressing the specifics of both the private practice and academic job search. This workshop is held on Friday evening prior to the ACG Postgraduate Course.



Endoscopy School Hands-On Workshop Center at the Annual Meeting offers residents the opportunity to get hands-on endoscope training, with experts providing guidance on the use of scopes as residents navigate tasks using the Thompson Endoscopic Skills Trainer (T.E.S.T.); trainees can participate in sessions with expert faculty demonstrating techniques using a wide variety of equipment and products, and then have the opportunity to practice using the equipment.



The Mentoring Program provides ACG resident and trainee members with access to clinicians from diverse practice models, academic departments, and geographic regions.



GI Jeopardy is a friendly competition among GI training programs across North America. The competition consists of two stages; an online preliminary round where all GI programs are invited to compete and a final round where two person teams from the top five scoring programs compete in front of a live audience at the ACG Postgraduate Course.



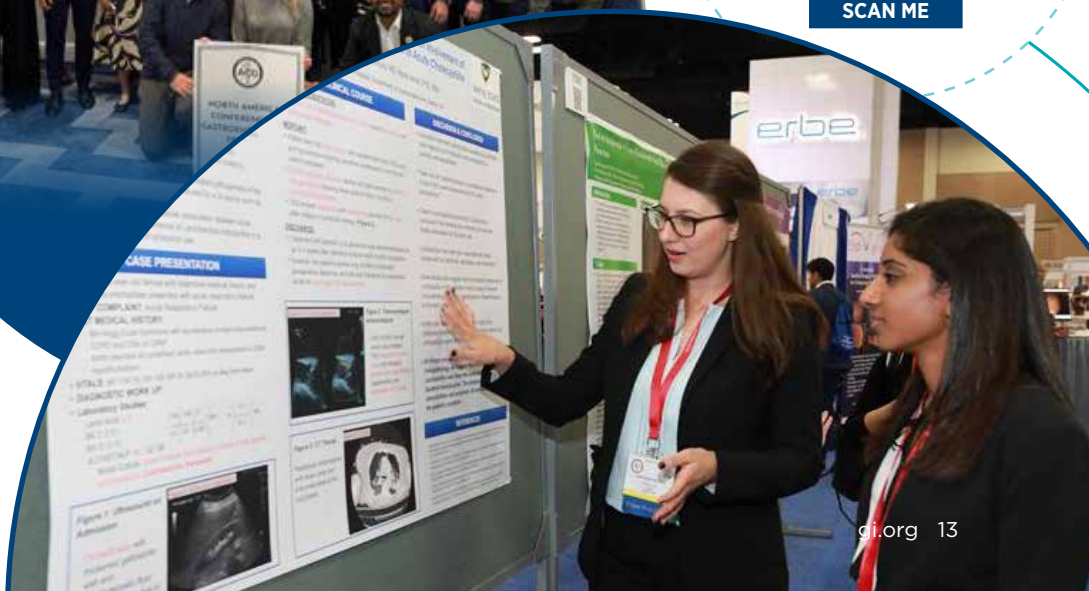


