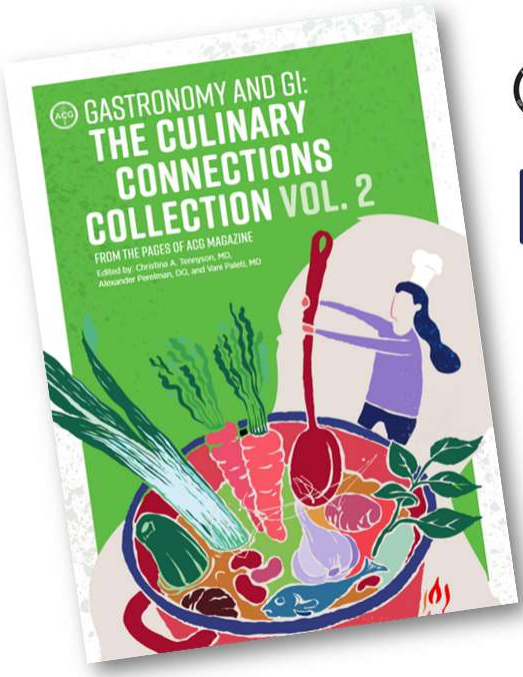





The AHN Experience

- **What We Did:**
 - Saturday Screenings, media outreach, community-based initiatives
 - **“Eye on Awareness, Outreach, Prevention and Screening”** media campaign in the Pittsburgh area
 - Shared info with viewers on the importance of colorectal cancer screening and screening opportunities at AHN
 - Local TV segment and collaboration with a local radio station
 - A colorectal cancer survivor shared his experience with viewers and explained that a colonoscopy is nothing to fear
 - AHN also used digital banner ads, social media, Hulu TV, and print ads

The AHN Experience

- What Was the Outcome?
 - Increased number of screenings which would have otherwise not been performed due to barriers
 - 220 colonoscopies performed; 207 surveys completed; 86% indicated more likely to do colonoscopy if scheduled on a Saturday
 - 38% had at least 1 adenoma, 119 adenomas, 8 TVA, 17 SSA

The AHN Experience

- Why it Matters
 - Increased access to care; improved patient experience, decreased overall cost by prevention of disease morbidity and mortality
 - Top 3 reasons for lack of / delayed screening to date:
 - Taking a day off work by patient or significant other (42%)
 - Concern for complications
 - Concern for prep tolerability
- How You Can Do This Too
 - Get community BUY-IN.....Ask the following questions:
 - *Why we do it?*
 - *How we will do it?*
 - *What we will do?*

- Next Day Procedure: Clear Liquid Diet and NPO
- Diet Order Therapeutic: Clear Liquid; 2 gm Sodium, No Caffeine
DIET EFFECTIVE NOW, Starting today at 2204, Until Specified
Diet Type: Therapeutic
Therapeutic Diet: Clear Liquid
Additional Restrictions: 2 gm Sodium, No Caffeine
Stop at 07:00 AM on day of procedure
- NPO Except for: All Meds
EFFECTIVE TODAY AT BREAKFAST, Starting tomorrow at 0700, Until Specified
Reason: Surgery/Procedure
Except for: All Meds
Tube Feed: Hold while NPO (if ordered)
NPO except medications at 07:00 on day of procedure
- Same Day Procedure: NPO Now
DIET EFFECTIVE NOW, Until Specified

Medications

Bowel Prep Orders

High Risk bowel prep if: previously failed bowel prep, history of 2 day bowel prep, Parkinson's disease, colonic inertia, severe constipation, bed-ridden or wheelchair bound.

 - Order between 09:00 and 17:00 for NEXT day procedure
 - PEG 3350 with electrolytes (GOLYTEL) solution 2,000 mL

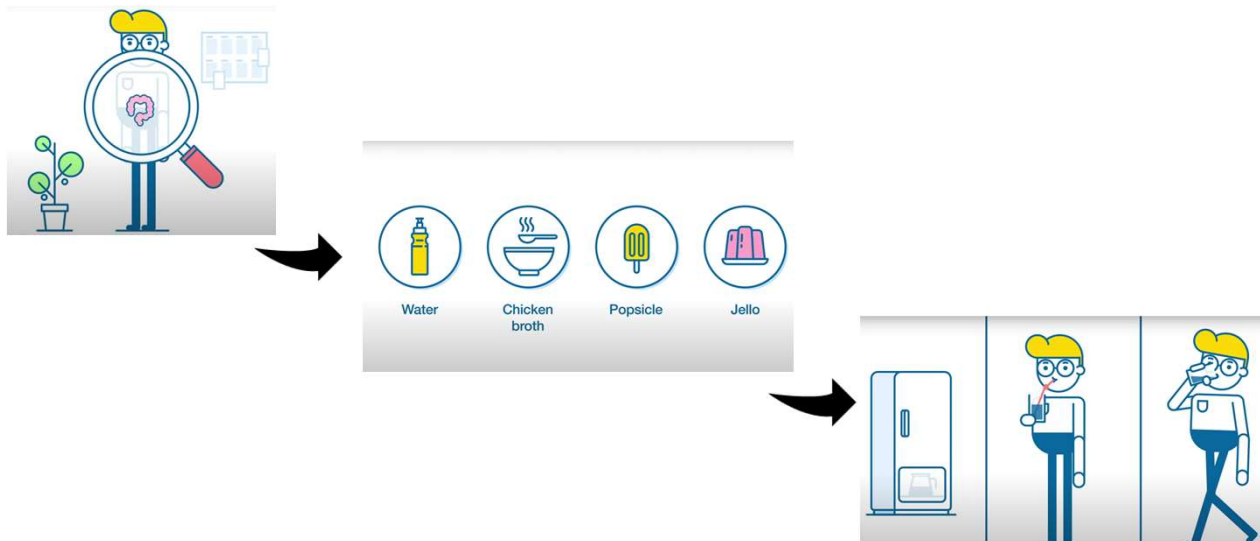

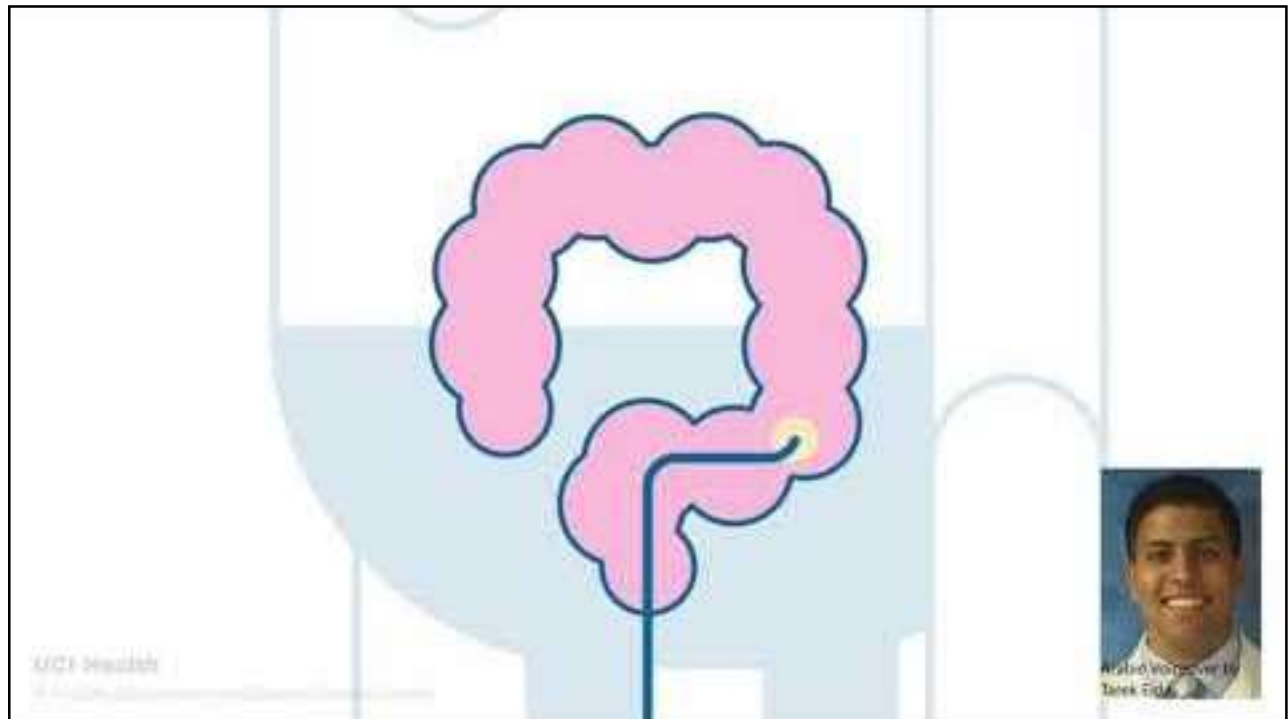

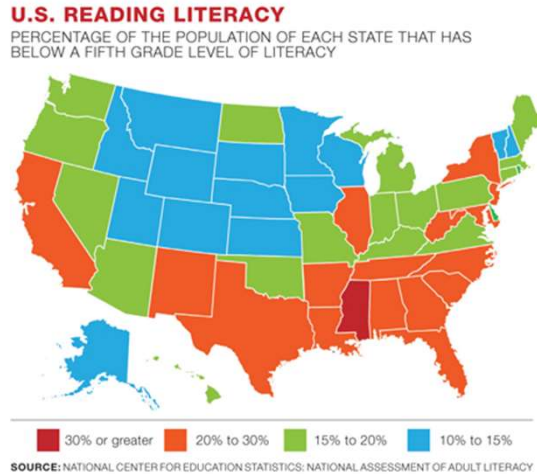

What was the Outcome: Prep for the Prep




- QI project at UT Health Science Center San Antonio:
 - Showed 78% of inpatient preps were fair or poor
 - Order set implementation led to a 46% decrease in inadequate prep
- Prospective single center study at Northwestern University:
 - Electronic inpatient bowel prep order set inclusive of a split dose preparation algorithm improved colonoscopy quality and reduced repeat procedures.

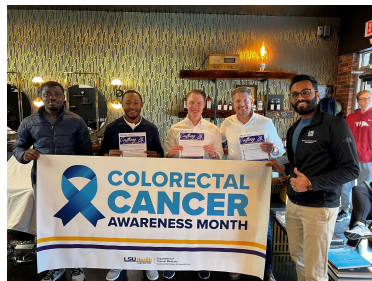

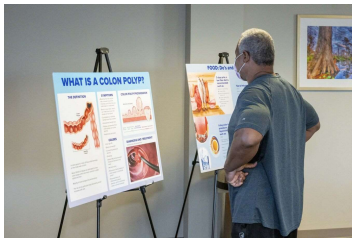

Cutting OUT COLON CANCER

Colorectal Cancer has one of the highest occurrence rates in the United States in Louisiana. There are often NO or little symptoms for colorectal cancer. Screenings are vital for early detection and treatment.

COLORECTAL CANCER & SCREENING FACTS

- Colorectal Cancer is a malignant tumor involving parts of the colon and rectum.
- Symptoms of colorectal cancer may include blood in stools and weight loss
- African American and Hispanic individuals are more affected than other races.
- Individuals with family history of colorectal cancer are at higher risk.
- Colonoscopies are painless and take roughly 15 minutes while sedated.
- A colonoscopy screening is free for those with Medicaid or Medicare.
- If a colonoscopy comes back normal, another isn't needed for 10 years.

- Is not the disease of only older people
- Screening on time saves lives

- Anyone can get colon cancer
- Colon Cancer does not discriminate based on sex, gender, and race
- You may not have any symptoms at the early stage of colon cancer

More and more younger people are getting colon cancer

- Screening for colon cancer on time can save your life

What are the screening tests for colon cancer?

1. Fecal immunochemical Test (FIT)

- This test looks for hidden blood in your stool
- You can do this test at home
- You do not have to drink a bowel cleansing solution for this test
- If the test comes back positive, you need to have further testing done with colonoscopy

2. Colonoscopy

- It is a video camera test which checks for tissue growth on the inside wall of your colon
- A long flexible tube with camera and light at the end is used to look inside your colon
- It is painless test
- You will be asleep during the procedure
- You will need to drink the bowel cleansing solution a day prior to the test

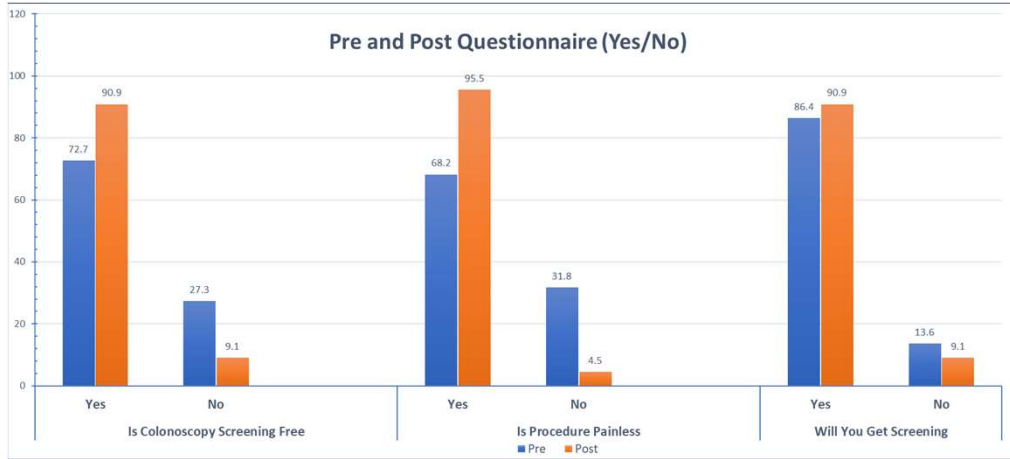

Why it Matters

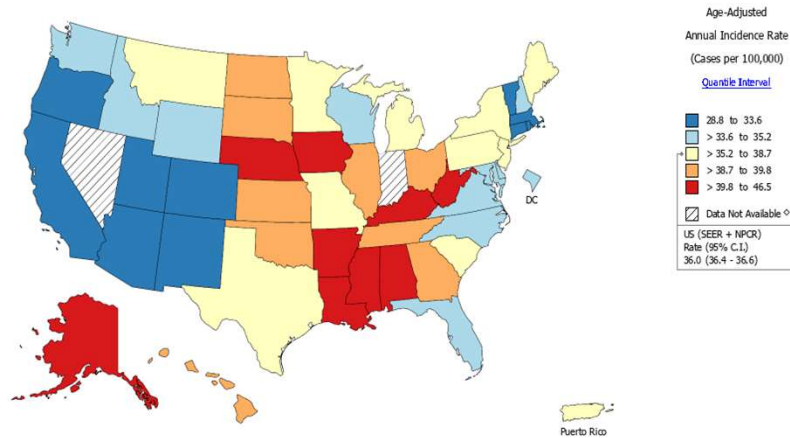
- Louisiana is among the states with the highest CRC incidence rate.
- Louisiana Ranked 6th in colorectal cancer-related death
- Low screening rate due to
 - Lack of awareness and inadequate knowledge/information about the disease
 - Lack of awareness of different screening modalities.
 - Fear of complication from screening: painful,
 - Mistrust about the overall health system, especially in minority population
 - Lack of recommendation by primary care doctors
 - Systemic healthcare disparity

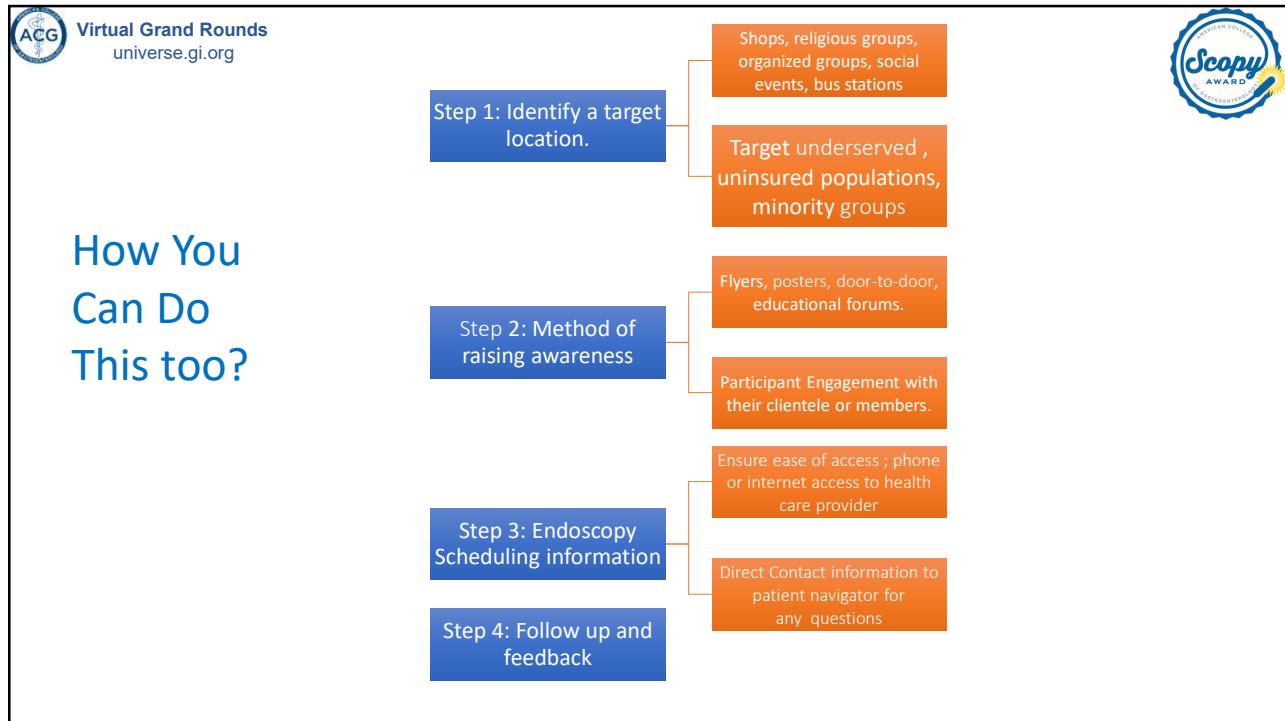

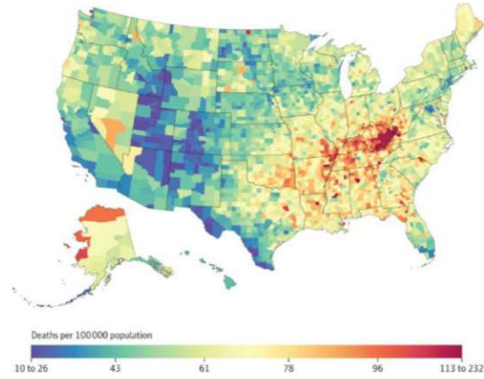
